Building master plan

The Toledo Library is embarking on an ambitious multi-phase, multi-year building master plan beginning in 2025. Chapter One encompasses:

- The development of the Washington Branch into a robust library campus, which will include a new branch building, the Friends of the Library book center, and a Library operations center.
- A new library and conservation center in western Lucas County—a facility that will be developed in partnership with Metroparks Toledo and will be the first of its kind in the United States.
- Major renovations at the Heatherdowns, Holland, and Maumee branches.

2023: Institute of Museum and Library Science (IMLS) National Gold Medal

The National Gold Medal highest honor that can be awarded to a library system or museum in the United States.

TLCPL has been recognized by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its annual comprehensive financial report for 27 consecutive years.

Toledo Library signature collections

Several signature collections, each with a dedicated and specialized focus, help Toledo Library customers expand their horizons.

- Art Tatum African American Resource Center: an ever evolving collection, founded in 1989, that acknowledges the cultural heritage and lived experiences of African Americans.
- Jennifer Fisher Nancy Drew Collection: books and memorabilia featuring the intrepid young detective in the nation's largest public collection of Nancy Drew books and memorabilia.
- Robert L. and Posy Huebner Collection: more than 240 works of original art by illustrators of children's literature are featured at Main Library and throughout other branches.
- Steinem Sisters Collection: the country's only special feminist collection to be housed within a public library has more than 900 titles plus programs that build community.

Toledo Library service highlights

Welcome Toledo Lucas County

Welcome Toledo Lucas County (Welcome TLC) is a cross-sector network of community partners that is housed at the Toledo Lucas County Public Library. Welcome TLC's mission is to build a more welcoming and inclusive community for immigrants, refugees, and people of diverse cultures that supports a vibrant civic, economic, and social fabric for all.

Small Business and Nonprofit Department

Whether customers already have a business or see an unmet need and want to start a business, the Toledo Library's Small Business and Nonprofit Resources Department has the expertise and tools to help. In 2024, the Small Business and Nonprofit Resources Department held **2,349** assistance sessions and hosted **106** public programs. The Toledo Lucas County Public Library provided nearly **\$3.2 million** in value to entrepreneurs and businesses in 2024:

- Research services value: **\$2,407,106**
- Training and education value: \$404,802
- Technology and equipment: \$234,483
- Physical space value: **\$83,814**
